OUR MISSION

The International Rescue Committee, Inc. (IRC) helps people whose lives and livelihoods are shattered by conflict and disaster to survive, recover and gain control of their future. Founded in 1933 at the request of Albert Einstein, the IRC offers lifesaving care and life-changing assistance to people forced to flee from war or disaster. At work today in over 40 countries and 25 U.S. cities, we restore safety, dignity and hope to millions who are uprooted and struggling to rebuild their lives. The IRC opened in Baltimore in 1999.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY: WELCOME HOME PROJECT

Every year, the IRC welcomes hundreds of refugees, people granted asylum and other humanitarian immigrants to the Baltimore metropolitan area. The Welcome Home Project (WHP) offers individuals or groups an opportunity to prepare an apartment to make it into a welcoming home for an incoming family.

HOW IT WORKS

 Training and Application: <u>RSVP here</u> to attend an information session to learn more. After the info session, you will receive a link to sign up for a Welcome Home Project training session. At least one member of your WHP group must attend both an IRC information session and WHP training, as well as submit a volunteer application.



- 2) Confirm and Begin Collecting: IRC asks each group to have one group leader to be the point of contact with our housing and logistics team. Your group leader contacts the established IRC point person to confirm your participation in WHP. The group leader will also contact the IRC point person once all items are collected. The IRC in Baltimore does not have storage space for collected items, so groups must be prepared to store items until set-up day.
- 3) Household Assignment: The IRC housing and logistics team will contact your team with a specific household assignment that includes set-up date, household size, ages, genders and country of origin, so that the WHP items can be tailored specifically to the household. The length of time between finished collection and assignment can range depending on the current need and available volunteers.
- 4) Set-Up Day: Your team transports items to the apartment on the scheduled day. All members sign a confidentiality agreement on set-up day to protect the safety and privacy of our clients. The set-up occurs in an empty apartment before household members have arrived.

Items to Collect (for a family of 5)

Italicized items are optional but always appreciated! You are welcome to add to both the variety and quantity of items listed below. If you believe a donation would be useful to a new home, you are likely right!

The IRC is committed to providing only new or gently used items to our clients. Used items should be clean. Items should not have tears or stains.

Kitchen
